## Text Level Tags:-

## <B> Tag:-

- $\langle\mathrm{B}>$ is bold tag .
- It bold face text appearing(take) between <B> and </B>.
- For example:-
- <B> this is bold text </B>
- Output:-
- this is bold text
<l> Tag:-
- <l> is Italic tag .
- It Italicize the text appearing between <l> and </l>.
- For example:-
- <l> this is Italic text </l>
- Output:-
- this is Italic text


## <U> Tag:-

- <U> is underline tag.
- It underline text appearing between <U> and </U>.
- For example:-
- <U> this is underline text </U>
- Output:-
- this is underline text
- You should generally avoid underlining text because that is how browsers indicate hypertext links In web pages.
<PRE> tag :-
- <PRE> is preformat the text.
- The text appearing between <PRE> and </PRE> is displayed in monospace form.
- Using this tag position the characters.
- It is used for columnar lists.
- Text in a pre element is displayed in a fixed-width font, and it preserves both spaces and line breaks
- For Eg.:-
- <PRE> Name Marks Percentage </PRE>
- It will display as: Name Marks Percentage


## <SUB> Tag:-

- <SUB> is subscript tag.
- The text enclosed in <SUB> and </SUB> is displayed in subscript form.
- It is bit lower than text.
- This is used for mathematical formulas.
- For Eg.:-
- $\mathrm{H}<\mathrm{SUB}>2</ \mathrm{SUB}>\mathrm{O}$.
- Output:-
- $\mathrm{H}_{2} \mathrm{O}$


## <SUP> Tag:-

- <SUP> is superscript tag.
- The text enclosed in <SUP> and </SUP> is displayed in superscript form.
- This element is also useful for mathematical formulas.
- For Eg.:-
- $\mathrm{E}=\mathrm{MC}<S U P>2</ S U P>$
- Output:-
- $\mathrm{E}=\mathrm{MC}^{2}$
- it can be used for trade mark symbol.
- Use HCL <SUP> TM </SUP> Computers.
- It will be displayed as:
- Use HCL'M Computer


## <BIG>Tag:-

- <BIG> is Big tag.
- The text enclosed in <BIG> and </BIG> is displayed in larger font.
- <BIG> tag has the same effect as <FONT SIZE="+1">
- For Eg.:-
- <BIG> the Big company </BIG>
- Output:-
- the Big company
- If already size is largest tag is ignored.


## <SMALL> Tag:-

- <SMALL> is small tag.
- The text enclosed in <SMALL> and </SMALL> is displayed in smaller font.
- If size is smallest then tag is ignored.
- <SMALL> tag has the same effect as <FONT SIZE="-1">
- For Eg.:-
- <SMALL> the Small company </SMALL>
- Output:-
- the Small company


## <STRIKE> Tag:-

- This is strike tag.
- The text enclosed in <STRIKE> and </STRIKE> or (<S> And </S>) would have a line drawn though the middle of text.
- For Eg.:-
- <STRIKE> This is hopeless situation </STRIKE>
- This display will be :-

This is hopeless situation

## <MARQUEE> Tag:-

- This is marquee tag.
- The text enclosed in <MARQUEE> and </MARQUEE> would be rolled over horizontal line on the web page.
- This is used to roll the current news or position of different companies in stock market.
- For Eg.:- <MARQUEE> STOCK MARKET COLLAPSES </MARQUEE>.
- OUTPUT:- the display will be continuous rolling of words STOCK MARKET COLLAPSES


## <STRONG> Tag:-

- This is strong tag.
- The text appearing between <STRONG> And </STRONG> will be displayed in bold.
- This tag is used to create a strong importance.
- Text to speech reader gives strident (hard) pronunciation to strong text.
- For Eg.:-<P> I swear, if they don't give me that raise <STRONG> tomorrow </STRONG> , I quit. </P>.


## Output:-

- I swear, if they don't give me that raise tomorrow , I quit.
