Extension Activities

Year 2022-2023

The college encourages students to actively participate in extension activities, primarily focusing on social awareness and holistic development. The college has constituted the NSS monitoring committee for the organization of extension activities stated by the affiliating university. The college focused on the following extension activities through which the holistic development of the students is observed.

1. History:

After independence, Jawaharlal Nehru directed the Ministry of Education to formulate a suitable scheme for introducing national service into academic institutions.

- **2. Launch of NSS:** On 24 September 1969 launched the NSS in all states and universities in the country.
- **3. Symbol of NSS:** The symbol for the NSS is based on the giant Rath Wheel of the world-famous Konark Sun Temple in Odisha, India. It stands for continuity and change and implies the continuous striving of NSS.
- **4. Aim:** The program aims to instill social welfare in students and provide service to society without bias NSS volunteer's work to ensure that needy people get help to enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity. It also provides help in natural and artificial disasters by providing food, clothing, and first aid to disaster victims.

The selection is made through a multi-stage objective selection process, starting with the college level and going up to the National level. The college has received awards, trophies, and an Appreciation Letter from the Government of Maharashtra, University, Village Panchayat, and NGOs during the assessment period for the extension and outreach activities performed by the NSS unit. Historical Places Cleaning:

The Government of India has started "Swachha Bharat Mission" campaign from 2nd October with the aim to clean the streets, roads and infrastructure of cities, smaller towns and rural areas. In addition, it is necessary to clean and conserve the forts which are the historical monuments and the cultural heritage of India and Indians. The restoration of forts is important for conservation of history and for tourism.

Keeping this noble motive in mind, the department of Life Science & Computer Science Together with NSS Unit decided to work for the dilapidated state of heritage fort in the Udgir city and help in conservation of the historical places. The NSS Students Association organized the Udaygiri Fort Cleanup Drive in Udgir on 10th August 2022. This fort was built in pre-Bahamani age, dating from the twelfth century CE. It is famous for the historic Battle of Udgir of 1760, in which the Marathas, led by Sadashivrao Bhau, defeated the Nizam, and after which the Treaty of Udgir was signed.

72 students participated in this drive and cleaned the fort. The plastic bags, glass bottles, used dishes were disposed with the help of Udgir Municipal Corporation of Udgir city and many people appreciated the efforts taken by the SVM students. School Dropout Children Survey:

A School Dropout Children Survey_was organized on 5th oct 2022 in Nalgir village of Udgir city. The NSS units of Swami Vivekanand Mahavidyalaya Udgir conducted the survey, NSS Program officer Prof. Amar. J.Tandale, address to the student regarding the objectives of survey & various government policies which are implemented for the education of school droupout children. A dropout is an "ever-enrolled person" who does not complete the last level of education for which he/she has enrolled and is currently not attending any educational institution. The Government's Right to Education Act and National Policy on Education may have been motivating to provide education to all but it is equally important to analyze the sustainability and efficiency of the education system. Dropout rates are considered to be a great wastage in the education system, not only so many students leave school without acquiring basic skills, but their premature departure represents a significant waste of scarce education resources.

It is recommended that the government conducts awareness camps in cities, towns, and villages to expose the hazards of illiteracy and unemployment. National Education Policy 2020 has mentioned two initiatives that will be undertaken to curb the problem. The first is to provide efficient and sufficient infrastructure to all students and the second is to set up alternative and innovative education centers for the children of migrant laborers. These are vital steps to ensure that children have access to safe and engaging school education as well as bring back the ones out of school. A dropout early warning system enables schools to identify students who are at risk of dropping out of school, and to focus on individuals who struggle to perform well. Schools & colleges should practice innovative teaching methods to draw students towards education and spark interest in them. Digital learning strategies can be used to provide education in the confines of their homes, students can access free educational content through smart-phone applications or Youtube provided by different institutions.

Education enables a person to achieve a better job or means of self-employment, and climb out of intergenerational poverty. It cultivates cultural values and beliefs in the child. Once the awareness to send students regularly to the school continues, slow but sure results will follow.

AWARENESS RALLY ON FEMALE FOETICIDES

"SAVE GIRL CHILD"

NSS unit has organized awareness rally on female foeticides at village Shekhapur near Udgir City on 10th March 2022. Various Slogans were given to people by depicting the various poster. About 116 NSS volunteers have been actively participated in rally on female foeticides.

NSS Programme officer Prof. Amar. J.Tandale addressed the students and told volunteers about what is meant by Women Foeticide? Its Causes & measures to Control Women Foeticide.

Female Foeticide is a medical procedure where a female fetus is aborted in the womb of the pregnant woman after identifying the gender of the fetus through ultrasound. This act is illegal in India.

Measures to Control

A lot of measures have been taken to fight against this illegal practice.

- The government of India has initiated education and media advertisements to reach hospitals and clinics and medical professionals to spread awareness.
- The Indian Medical Association has shouldered efforts to prevent prenatal sex determination by promoting "Beti Bachao" during its meeting and conferences.
- The campaign of Beti-Bachao is initiated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi to raise awareness of the gender disparities created and resulting from sex-selective abortion.
- Some policies initiated by many states in India attempt to address the assumed economic disadvantage of girls by offering aids to girl and their parents.
- The dowry system, one of the main causes of Female Foeticide, should be abolished from society.
- Some policies provide scholarships and cash credits only to girls.
- Medical licenses must be terminated with immediate effect for the practitioners who are conducting Female Foeticide.
- The families who are forcing this act on their daughters-in-law should be penalized.
- Young women and girls should be empowered to stand for their rights. They should be self-reliant and become capable of making their decisions.

Conclusion

Through a lot of awareness, consideration, and understanding, we can bring a shift in our beliefs and perceptions of society to give equal status to the girl child. Besides, there is no past, present, or future without a woman and female infanticide or Female Foeticide should be considered as suicide. If we do not make a change and secure the future of these girls now, then the consequences would be dangerous and there would be no coming back from that curse. So, a little change in our mindset and attitude is all that is required to welcome daughters in our hearts and this world. Students share their views on this occasion .As an outcome of this activity all of them got awareness on Women Foeticide.

Awareness Programee on Disaster Management of Investigation Organized By NSS

An awareness Programme on "Disaster Management" was organised on 30th September every year in College Premises. The NSS units of SVM College conducted the programme. On this occasion of the programme, NSS Program officer Prof. Amar.J.Tandale, said that the Disaster Management is the organization and management of resources and responsibilities for dealing with all humanitarian aspects of emergencies, in particular preparedness, response and recovery in order to lessen the impact of disasters. The first groups of people to respond to a disaster are those living in the local community. They are the first to start rescue and relief operations. The Red Cross and Red Crescent National Societies therefore focus on community-based disaster preparedness, which assists communities to reduce their vulnerability to disasters and strengthen their capacities to resist them.

Dr. Sudhir. B. Jagtap addressed the Students on the **Importance of Disaster Management.** Disaster Management is very important in recent times. It is tackling the hazards that occur before, during and after the disaster. Disaster management is a similar act as consuming medicine for curing a disease. Disaster can also be in any form of epidemic diseases or industrial failures such as Bhopal gas tragedy or the disaster of Fukushima nuclear power plant, etc.

In the event of a disaster, proper preparations are essential for managing the situation. Proper mechanisms help to minimize the effect. Predicting the probability of some types of disasters can help in decreasing the vulnerability of the people.

Report On Water Conservation and Watershed Management

On the occasion of World Water Day on 22nd March 2022, Swami Vivekanand Mahavidyalaya in association with NSS Unit organized a Program on water conservation.

Many environmentalists participated in this program. The Program began at 10:00am.

Dr. D. S. Gond delivered a talk on the topic Water scarcity has become a big problem today; if it is not taken care of in time, it will become a threat in the future. Understanding the scarcity and importance of water, many people have started conserving water. And they also tell us that we can use water for many things, especially rainwater. Rainwater may be used for toilets, washing clothes, cleaning floors, watering plants and vehicles, gave their valuable talks on tips on water conservation.

- Make sure to turn off the faucet while brushing your teeth or shaving.
- Don't leave the tap running while you wash the dishes.
- Use the shower in bursts rather than running it continuously.
- Don't forget to change the water in the toilet tank.
- Try to limit the amount of laundry you do at one time.
- How long you wash clothes varies depending on people, but a normal amount of time is between 30-45 seconds per item. So figure it out by adding up all the items you have on your laundry list and multiply that by 30-45 secs for every item.
- As our city grows, rainwater harvesting provides a good alternative to meet its growing water needs while maintaining biodiversity. For example, you can use grass-filled

barrels to collect the rainwater as it falls, or you can use a flat cistern which is generally larger than a barrel and is equipped with a cover to prevent evaporation.

A simple way to conserve water is to recycle whenever possible.

Also, they requested all the students present there not to waste much water and try to save every single drop of water. Simultaneously, some students also gave speeches on water conservation.

In the end, the principal thanked everyone for participating in this program.

Report on National Science Day:

National Science Day-2022 was celebrated on 28th February by the Life Science Department of SVM, in virtual mode. The day is observed to remember the invention of the "Raman Effect" by Indian Physicist Sir C V Raman for which he earned the Nobel Prize.

The National Science Day-2022 programmes were held as part of "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" celebrations.
